COMPASSION CENTERS IN ADRV HELPS THE COMMUNITY THROUGH SOCIAL SERVICES

The Anglican Diocese of Rift Valley for many year now serves the community through child ministry. Currently the diocese has five compassion centres child ministry. These include the following:-

- Muhalala TZ 0359
- Mitundu TZ 0357
- Mwiboo TZ 0358
- Ikungi TZ 0379
- TZ 0341 Itigi

Compassion centers help their communities in education, health (physical & spiritual), economically, politically, emotionally and socially.

In education:

Compassion centres make sure a child or youth gets School fees, uniforms and stationary for their studies.

In health:

Compassion centers make sure that all beneficiaries get are physically fit. This include children and par-

ents . They are given National health insurance (NHIF or CHF). These help different hospitals.

Econoically:

Parents/guardians given special tips for entrepreneurship. On top of that they are helped financially in order to start

business which generate income for their families.

Some compassion cenhave ters been able to build houses for those children who come from poor family background.

Spiritually:

All compassion centers make sure that children are taught the word of God every Saturday and attend Sunday services. Children are also encouraged to join groups of choir and sing together gospel songs.

In addition, compassions centers connect children with Church Priests for bapthem to get treatments in tism and confirmation training.

ST. JOHN'S PLACE—ADRV PROVIDES EDUCATION IN DIFFERENT LEVELS

The Anglican Diocese of Rift Valley was inaugurated in 1991. Since that time the Diocese has managed to provide many social services in the communities around the Diocese. In the village of Kilimatinde Deanery of Kilimatinde there are five centers which provide social services; these are:

- St. John's Bible College.
- St. John's seminary for boys and girls.
- St. John's Vocational Education and Training Authority (Motor vehicle mechanics and tailoring).
- St. John's English Medium Pre & Primary School.
- Kilimatinde Hospital
- Kilimatinde Institute of Health and Allied Sciences

The photo on your right side show Bishop John Lupaa and Rev. Billyshani Msanjila the Area dean of Kilimatinde deanery as they visit students of St. John's Bible College.

The college existed since 1980 by then it was under the Anglican diocese of Central Tanganyika. The college became under the Anglican Diocese of Rift Valley which was inaugurated in 1991. The college provides Diploma in Theology and Certificate in Theology for three years course. Students comes from all Diocese in the Anglican Church of Tanzania.

The College has been supported by the German friends from Bernhausen and Berdurach for more than 23 years now.

Last month we have received 9,400 Euro for purchasing chairs, tables, cupboards, bed and mattresses for students. We have also received 12,000 Euro for purchasing of food and other basic needs for the college. God all German friends.





ST. JOHN'S SEMINARY FOR BOYS AND GIRLS (ORDINARY LEVELS)

St. John's seminary is an Ordinary level secondary school for boys and girls. under the Anglican Diocese of Rift Valley.

The school is at Kilimatinde village; and it is among the 10 best performed schools in Singida region and it is among three best schools in Manyoni district.

The following are results of form four and form two for the Academic year 2022/2023 according to the National Examination Council of Tanzania (NECTA)

education provided by our school; St. John's also runs Vocational training for all our students from form one to form four.

We thank God for all donors and parents who support our students. The Kilimatinde trust UK has been donating towards infrastructures and scholarship for students from poor families. You are welcome to donate. School fees for one student is Tshs 1,800,000= Many students wish to join our school.

St. John's English medium Pre and Primary school is day school located in Singida region, district of Manyoni-Kilimatinde village. The scholl started in 2016 and registered under the Ministry of Education Tanzania with a reference number EM.18456 in 2021.

The school has 78 pupils from nursery to standard seven class. We thank God that school infrastructures are all good. All our students stay at their parents; the school bus had to pick up them every morning from home to school. However, we do not have a dormitory which can help us add more students and income.



The school through ADRV got some support for the completion of the construction of St. John's English Medium Pre and Primary school from different donors.

Currently TRINITY MRED is the one supporting the construction of the new kitchen and Dining Hall which can accommodate more than 600 people at one time. This Dining hall will be used as a multiple hall for different activities at school.

Apart from this achievement of the multiple hall; we do not have chairs and tables for servings. One chair costs Tshs 30,000= and one table which can be surrounded by four people is costs Tshs 240,000=

ST. JOHN'S ENGLISH MEDIUM PRE & PRIMARY FUTURE PLANS

To add more students at our school.

- This plan can only be possible if we get the funds to build two hostels/ dormitories for boys and girls. Many parents who stay far from where the school is ask if we can accommodate their children; but we normally tell them that it is impossible.
- To encourage parents to bring their children for the affordable school fees.
- In addition we ask any one who wish to pay school fees for pupils from poor families. So far we thank God for all people who donate through the Kilimatinde Trust UK which transfer the money into our school account. God bless you!
- To raise funds in order to buy 4 Gas cookers. Each one costs 3,500,000= therefore, we will need Tshs 14,000,000= to get all of them. The government of Tanzania is in the campaign to stop the use of firewood as a source of fire.
